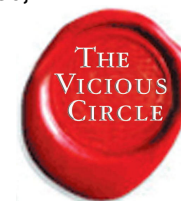

New Sea to Sky Highway Signage explains Aboriginal Heritage and Territory

As you travel along the new Highway 99, you may have noticed 7 new sign shelters, community gateway rock signs and aluminum guide signs. These are all part of an initiative known as Cultural Journey Sea to Sky hosted by the Squamish and Lil'wat First Nations and coordinated by the Squamish Lil'wat Cultural Centre in Whistler, BC.

Each sign panel describes the cultural significance of the area to Squamish and Lil'wat Nations and the connection to the Cultural Centre.

Cultural Journey Sea to Sky is an initiative designed to revitalize aboriginal tourism in the Sea to Sky Corridor and to support the growth of the overall tourism industry through:

- Educational kiosks;
- Highway 99 Signage featuring traditional languages;
- Sea to Sky Visitor guides (available Spring 2010);
- Aboriginal Cultural Centre in Whistler;
- Aboriginal Tourism Training
